We held our Annual General Meeting on April 29, 2026, where we welcomed a new Board and said goodbye to a couple of outgoing Directors. We would like to thank them for their contributions and dedication.

At this time, the position of **Treasurer remains vacant**. We would warmly welcome someone (with references) to step forward and support our Board in this role. The time commitment is minimal—less than a couple of hours per month.

During the meeting, we also took time to celebrate some of our recent successes.

Our largest initiative has been the **Beach Re-Imagined Project**. Through a three-way collaboration—supported by a grant from the Enabling Accessibility Fund (Western Canada and Territories Region), Employment and Social Development Canada, along with the Summer Village and the Mewatha Beach Community Association—we have completed:

- A new accessible trail to the beach
- Concrete improvements under the picnic shelter
- A new changeroom


These enhancements have made the beach more accessible for everyone—from families with strollers, those in wheelchairs, to seniors—ensuring all residents can enjoy our beautiful lakeside space. Additional improvements are planned over the next year or two.
